RECOGNITION AWARDS GIVEN TO ADULTS FROM SNOHOMISH COUNTY

(A) – award given at annual meeting in January
(B) – award given at End of year Celebration in June

- SEBAGO – (A)** **Pin depicting the out-of-doors.**
For outstanding contributions in the field of camping or outdoor programs.
- SHAWNEQUAS – (A)** **Pin depicting hand, heart and thought.**
For outstanding contributions within the area of support services to leaders and youth.
- JOHN COLLIER – (A)** **Pin designed with symbols of heart and corn.**
For outstanding contributions in the fields of finance, business, fundraising, or consulting.
- LUTHER HALSEY GULICK – (A)**
Pin shows crossed logs and flames within the Wohelo triangle.
- EARNEST THOMPSON SETON – (A)** **Pin with symbol for creation.**
For outstanding contributions as an administrative volunteer.
- CHARLOTTE JOY FARNSWORTH – (A)** **Pin with symbols signifying growth, strength and support.**
For contributions to an area or large geographical section of the council in the area of administrative operations.
- WAKAN – (B)** **Pin with crossed logs and flame, heart, hand and arms.**
For exceptional and imaginative service to youth over a period of at least three years.
- HITENI – (A)** **Gold Pin representing life more abundant and desire for attainment.**
For council wide extensive and innovative services to youth for a period of at least four years.
- KAREN WARREN MEMORIAL AWARD – (A)**
Recipients name on permanent plaque at the Camp Fire Service Center.

- LOU DENNEY – (A) Name on permanent plaque at the Camp Fire Service Center.**
For exceptional community service involvement having a significant impact on youth in Snohomish County. This award named after Lou Denney, long time Executive Director of Camp Fire in Snohomish County.
- AREA SERVICE TEAM – (B) A gold pin with blue and white background.**
For a year of service as a member of an Area Service Team as Manager, Club Consultant or Club Organizer.
- TENURE – (B) Gold pins with colors corresponding to Tenure.**
For years of registered adult membership in Camp Fire. Given for 3, 5, 7, 10, and every 5 years up to 50 years.
- BLUE RIBBON – (B) Pin with Blue and Red Ribbons of enamel.**
For outstanding contributions above and beyond the call of duty. Given to volunteers by each area.
- YOU MADE IT THROUGH 1ST YEAR – (B) For 1st Year Leaders.**

UNIFORMS

An important part of any group affiliation is showing that you belong. For Camp Fire, symbols of belonging are the official national attire, council-created items and a variety of beads, emblems and pins. Wearing Camp Fire attire communicates membership in a national organization as well as a small group. Wearing Camp Fire attire also creates awareness and visibility of Camp Fire as leading organization for children for children and families. For children, wearing the uniform gives them a very important feeling of belonging to their group as well as the Camp Fire organization.

The traditional Camp Fire uniform is red, white and blue, chosen to show the importance of patriotism to Camp Fire. The informal uniform is any Camp Fire T-shirt with pants or jeans. The official formal uniform consists of the short sleeved polo-style or long-sleeved turtleneck styled shirt, a red sash for Little Stars, a red vest for Starflight, a royal blue vest for Adventure and khaki or navy pants, shorts or skirt with sport socks.

The formal and informal attire is the same for adults as it is for children. Polo shirts with khakis or navy pants are appropriate for nearly everyone. Some adults may choose to add a navy blazer for very formal occasions. It is important for a leader to wear the uniform. If youth sense that it isn't important for their leader, it won't be important to them.

AWARD DISPLAYS

In our council there are several options for displaying awards earned by our youth. They might decorate their Camp Fire sash (Little Stars), or vest with their awards or they might want to create other display items such as a banner, a sash or a wall hanging. A pattern for "add-a-patch" may be purchased at the Camp Fire Store. (item number T00116)

Your club may also choose to receive a certificate rather than beads or emblems when they have completed their work. These may be purchased at the Camp Fire Store as well.
